Virtual Virginia

- Virtual Virginia is a division of the Virginia Department of Education.
- Approval for virtual instruction followed the timeline below:
 - May 2021: Families interested in virtual instruction for the 2021-22 school year were asked to submit a request.
 - O June 2021: School based committees approved or denied virtual instruction and informed families
 - O July 2021: Approved students were enrolled in Virtual Virginia. All students were required to be enrolled by July 15, 2021
 - August 2021: Based on additional parent requests for virtual instruction, a wait list was established.
 - O August 24, 2021: First day of school for students enrolled in Virtual Virginia



Virtual Virginia Enrollment

Elementary:

July 15th Enrollment: 48 students
 Enrollment as of Sept. 9: 44 students

Secondary:

July 15th Enrollment: 62 students
 Enrollment as of Sept. 9: 50 students

- Additional enrollment is contingent upon approval from Virtual Virginia
- Students enrolled in Virtual Virginia are permitted to return to in-person instruction at any time.

Remote Learning for Inclement Weather Days

As outlined in Superintendent's Memo #230-21:

"Pursuant to HB1790/SB1132 a school or division may apply up to 10 unscheduled remote learning days towards their 180-day or 990-hour requirement provided that instruction and other student services are delivered in alignment with VDOE's Guidance for Unscheduled Remote Learning Days."

Goal for Remote Learning for Inclement Weather Days:

• Ensure every Prince George County Public Schools student is provided access to **timely** and **relevant** instruction during inclement weather days when school buildings are closed, and a virtual inclement weather day is declared.



State Guidelines for Remote Learning for Inclement Weather Days

- Power and other required utilities necessary for the provision of instruction and services are still available for students and staff throughout the division;
- Students receiving supports under an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan will be able to access services, as applicable and appropriate;
- The division will provide student support services (e.g. counseling, consultation, assessment, skill instruction) to students, as appropriate;
- The division maintains school meal services for students



State Guidelines for Remote Learning for Inclement Weather Days - Cont.

- All teachers and staff have been provided expectations for provision of instruction and services to all students;
- Student services personnel been provided expectations for provision of services to all students;
- All students have computing devices, Internet connection, and/or other supplemental supplies necessary for successful engagement in instruction;
- Any student that may be unable to access remote instruction and/or assignments will be provided sufficient opportunity to complete instruction and/or assignments without penalty.



Procedures for Remote Learning for Inclement Weather Days

When inclement weather is anticipated that is deemed to potentially require school buildings to close, the following procedures will be followed:

- Teachers will deploy Chromebooks and chargers to each student if they are not already allowed to take the Chromebook home.
- Students will be instructed to log in to their instructional platform before dismissal (Google Classroom and/or Canvas) to download instructional materials/assignments.
- Downloading instructional materials ensures all students have access to asynchronous instructional materials regardless of access to internet.
- Teachers will provide their students with the synchronous/asynchronous links to either Zoom and/or Google Meet.





Remote Learning for Quarantined Students



Remote Learning for Quarantined Students

As outlined in the VDOE Superintendent's Memo #230-21:

"a student who is not ill and is able to participate in remote instruction should be offered meaningful opportunities to do so." Further, "divisions should be prepared to support students who are healthy enough to participate in remote learning during quarantine."

- It is highly recommended that students identified as being quarantined due to exposure to COVID-19 are provided opportunities for synchronous instruction during the regular school day.
- To maintain engagement with our quarantined students, we will offer a continuum of instruction from synchronous to asynchronous.



Guidelines & Procedures for Remote Instruction of Quarantined Students

- Quarantined students attend direct instruction via Zoom or Google Meet.
- The period of time designated for synchronous instruction may be determined by the teacher and is dependent upon student need.
- It is recommended quarantined students be offered the opportunity for synchronous instruction for each subject/class period.
- After attending synchronous instruction for each subject/class period, quarantined students may complete asynchronous activities through Google Classroom or another modality dependent upon teacher recommendation.
- Students participating in synchronous instruction while quarantined will be marked as present for the subjects/class periods they attend.
- Students not able to attend synchronously will be marked absent but will be provided sufficient opportunity to complete instruction and/or assignments without penalty.



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
